GRAPHICS BY VICTOR VASARELY


PRINT ROOM · CARNEGIE

ARTHUR THOMPSON was born in Boston, Mass. where he had his instruction in art and architecture at Harvard University, at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and at the Boston Architectural Center. He has been a resident of Maine since 1947.

Although, through the years, he has kept his hand at painting and drawing as a fine art, most of his professional life has been with various architectural firms: Stone and Webster, Parker Thomas and Rice, Dewey and Almy Chemical Company, Walter Bogner Associates, United States Army Engineers, Cleverdan, Varney and Pike, and numerous others. More recently, he served as an assistant to the late George Savage, architectural firm of Eaton W. Tarbell and Associates, where he worked on the designs of the Bangor Recreational Center, the new Bangor High School, and many other buildings over the past eight years.

Thompson's paintings and drawings have been widely shown in group exhibitions at the Grace Horne Gallery, Boston; the New Gallery, Boston; the Boston Arts Festival; the Provincetown Art Gallery; Rockport Art Association. One-man exhibitions of his art have been held at the Sante Fe Art Gallery; Harvard University; M.I.T.; Boston Architectural Center; the Bangor Library; University of Maine Art Gallery (1957-1964); Neighborhood House, Northeast Harbor, and at Pennsylvania State University where, in 1963, he taught drawing and color.

Mr. Thompson, with his author-wife, makes his home and studio at Sorrento, Maine.



ROMANOS RIZK of Provincetown, Mass. is presented at the University of Maine in this exhibition of thirty acrylic-collage paintings, selected and assembled by the Shore Galleries of Boston, Mass.

Rizk who has had his residence and studio-school for the past eighteen years in Provincetown, Mass., has recently returned from an extensive trip through the Middle East, including Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Israel and Greece, where he made a study of both contemporary and old world art.

For the past five summers Rizk has been teaching at the Romanos Rizk School of Painting in Provincetown, Mass., where he is also a trustee of the Provincetown Art Association. Recent awards include the Providence Art Club spring exhibition second prize, 1967; Artists Association of Nantucket first prize, 1966; Falmouth Artists Guild first prize, 1965, and second prize, 1966; Cape Cod Art Association third prize, 1964, and first prize, 1965.





GEORGE DANIELL, painter and photographer has selected fifty photographs for this unusual show, which he entitles MAINE-KEY WEST. Daniell summers near Ellsworth, Maine and winters at Key West, Florida.

As an undergraduate student at Yale University, he started taking photographs while traveling in Germany one summer, and then proceeded to do series of portraits of his classmates and professors, eventually attaining a merit of work to qualify his pictures into such publications as Life, Time, Coronet, Esquire, U.S. Camera, Wisdom, Down East Magazine and many other outstanding magazines. Examples of his work were included in Steichen's exhibition "Then and Now" at the Museum of Modern Art in New York, and in "America's Many Faces", which toured the world. Several photographs of John Marin and Georgia O'Keeffe are in the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art.

Although widely and chiefly known for his photography, Daniell has worked in oil and watercolor, having won awards and having had one-man exhibitions in various galleries. His paintings are included in the University's Artists of Maine Exhibition, and in the University of Maine Traveling Exhibitions. This is his second one-man show at the University of Maine.
